(a) Accessory buildings and/or guest houses are any detached subordinate building, the use of which is incidental, appropriate, and subordinate to that of the main building. No such structure shall have any more than one (1) sink connected to an approved effluent drainage system.

WHEREAS, it is the city's desire to limit development to one single family residence per lot with allowed accessory uses; and

WHEREAS, the city desires to make illegal any renting of living quarters of any nature within an accessory building on a residential lot; and

WHEREAS, Accessory Buildings are currently defined as "any subordinate building or portion of a main building, the use of which is incidental, appropriate and subordinate to that of the main building.

WHEREAS, the city will not approve the use of accessory buildings which are capable of being utilized for the purpose of independent living quarters; and

WHEREAS, the city believes that in order for a structure to be made suitable for living quarters it generally is equipped with both operable kitchen and bathroom facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUNES CITY. AS FOLLOWS:

The City of Dunes City amends the current definition of Accessory Building as follows: "Any detached subordinate building the use of which is incidental, appropriate, and subordinate to that of the main building. No such structure shall have nay more than one sink connected to an approved effluent drainage system to the exterior building."
