WHEREAS, the City of Dunes City is concerned for the health and safety of its citizens and the people who visit this area; and

WHEREAS, Woahink Lake serves as a drinking water source for many Dunes City and Lane County residents, as well as visitors to Honeyman State Park; and

WHEREAS, the City of Dunes City is concerned about the protection of the quality of the water in Woahink Lake; and

WHEREAS, for the most part, the Highway 101 corridor passes along the western boundary of Dunes City, is constructed so runoff from the highway enters into drainage that drains into Woahink Lake, and the roadway itself comes in very close proximity to Woahink Lake's edge; and

WHEREAS, should a motor vehicle accident occur on said roadway in the location where the roadway comes so close to the lake's edge, it is likely vehicles involved in the accident would end up in the lake; and

WHEREAS, it appears in these difficult economic times that the State of Oregon is without sufficient funds to adequately maintain and repair Highway 101 in the area from the Siltcoos River Bridge north to the Siuslaw River Bridge as said roadway is riddled with potholes, washouts, and exposed aggregate, thus potentially rendering the roadway unsafe for travel at the speed limits currently posted; and

WHEREAS, the roadway conditions also render it unsafe for motor vehicles to pass one another at increased rates of speed due to the increased risk of losing control of their vehicles;

- (1) Fire protection;
- (2) Street construction, maintenance, & lighting;
- (3) Storm sewers; and

Section 1. The annual administrative fees associated with the use of Dunes City's domestic water right on Woahink Lake are modified as follows:

- b. The annual administrative fee for a community system shall be \$100.
- c. The annual administrative fee for a permit holder with an irrigation only line shall be \$100.

- 5. Unanticipated volunteer projects or exposure not addressed herein will be added onto Dunes City's coverage agreement (1) by endorsement, (2) with advance notice to CIS, and (3) allowing two weeks for processing. It is hereby acknowledged that coverage of this type cannot be backdated.
